BANANA SPLIT CAKE

3 sticks margarine; 2 cups graham crackers; 2 eggs;
2 cups powdered sugar; 1 package chopped nuts;
1 medium jar maraschino cherries; 5 or 6 bananas;
1 medium can crushed pineapple;
1 medium container cool whip;

Mix 1 stick margarine and cracker crumbs together. Pat in bottom of large 9x13 inch pan. Mix powdered sugar, eggs and 2 sticks of margarine. Beat 10 to 15 minutes till creamy and thick. Place on top of crumbs; slice bananas length wise and lay on top of mixture. Spread drained pineapple over bananas and spread cool whip over top and sprinkle with chopped nuts and cherries.

1 package (4-serving size) Jell-O Pistachio Flavor Fat Free Sugar Free Instant Reduced Calorie Pudding & Pie Filling;
1 can (8 ounces) crushed pineapple in juice, undrained; 1 container (8 ounces) Breyers Vanilla Lowfat Yogurt; 2 cups plus 6 tablespoons thawed Cool Whip Free Whipped Topping, divided.

Stir pudding mix, pineapple with juice and yogurt in large bowl until well blended. Gently stir in 2 cup of the whipped topping. Refrigerate 1 hour or until ready to serve. Top each serving with 1 tablespoon remaining whipped topping

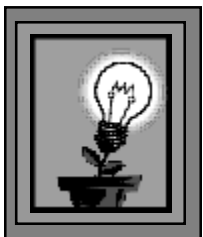
