Channel 23.2 El Dorado Arkansas

The COACB is well known and often receives requests for technical assistance from Christian groups from across the US and around the world. Usually we are their last hope with no one else they can go to for help. We help all that we can.

We received a call from Rev Duane Amis, station manager of KLMB, a class A station owned by Kingdom Broadcasting in El Dorado, Arkansas. Their station did not have the money to go digital and the time for Class A Stations to convert to digital had expired so the station had to go off the air. The FCC was planning to change KLMB from Class A to a Low Power station which would allow the FCC to sell their frequency for broadband services.

I talked to Duane and I told him that it might already be too late but I laid out all the steps he must do immediately to try to save the station. He followed my instructions and the FCC gave him 30 days to get the station back on the air as digital.

Converting a station to digital is very expensive but with the 30 day window now open, Joe Holland his engineer, Duane and I tried to hatch a Mission Impossible type plan. The most expensive piece of equipment is the encoder / multiplexer but the COACB had a spare one in the back room that had not been used for five years. I called all the board members of the COACB and each gave approval to use the encoder multiplexer. I called Joe and Duane with the news and also told them that I also had a spare 5 watt digital transmitter. With special temporary authority from the FCC we could use that transmitter to get out about 4 miles but at least it would be on the air and save the license.

When people learned that the KLMB would definitely be going back on the air if only at that very low power, donations started again. Duane raised enough money to buy a new transmitter.

The COACB encoder/multiplexer and the new transmitter arrived and both were installed just two days before the 30 day deadline expired. KLMB is on the air spreading the Gospel. Look for the COACB programming on KLMB 23.2 in El Dorado. First! Give The Lord Glory for bringing it to pass but I sure do love it when a plan comes together.

SALMON APPETIZER

One 15 ounce can salmon or 2 cups cooked salmon (flaked); One 8 ounce package of creamed cheese, softened; 4 tablespoons mild or medium salsa; 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley; 1 teaspoon dried Cilantro; 1/4 teaspoon ground Cumin (optional); 8 flour Tortillas (8 inch)

Drain salmon. Remove any bones. In a small bowl combine salmon, creamed cheese, salsa, parsley, and Cilantro. Add Cumin, if desired. Spread about 2 tablespoons of the salmon mixture over each tortilla. Roll each tortilla up tightly and wrap individually with plastic wrap. Refrigerate for 2 or 3 hours. Slice each tortilla into bite sized pieces. Yield 48 appetizers.

MOM'S MEATLOAF

2 eggs; 3/4 cup milk; 2/3 cup finely crushed saltines; 1/2 cup chopped onions; 1 tsp salt; Dash pepper; 1 1/2 lb lean ground beef; 1 cup ketchup; 1/2 cup packed brown sugar

In large bowl beat eggs. Add milk, saltines, onion, salt and pepper. Add beef and mix well. Shape into an 8 1/2 " x 4 1/2" loaf in an ungreased shallow pan. Combine remaining ingredients. Spread 3/4 ketchup and brown sugar mix over meat loaf. Bake at 350° for 60 - 65 minutes until no pink remains. Let stand 10 minutes then slice and serve with remaining sauce.

TACO SOUP

1 pound hamburger; 1 small onion, chopped; 1 package taco seasoning mix; 2 cans chili beans; 1 or 2 cans hominy, or can corn may be used; 1 can stewed tomatoes; 1 can Rotel; 1 small can green chilies; 1 package Hidden Valley ranch dressing mix.

Brown meat and onion together and drain. Put all ingredients in a large stew pan, **DO NOT DRAIN ANY OF THE CANS.** Heat until good and hot. It depends on how spicy the Rotel is on how spicy the soup will be. Sometimes I just use 1/2 can of Rotel. Good served with grated cheese on each serving and cornbread.

New Video Technology Coming

Currently COACB stations use composite video also sometimes referred to as analogue video. Composite video is easy to use and by far the least expensive but it is impossible to broadcast the same quality picture that you get out of the camera because every piece of equipment and every cable lowers the final quality of the picture.

Our current encoders and switching routers use only composite video so we have to convert the output of the digital cameras to composite before it can currently be used.

We are in the process of converting all video over to SDI video. This way the video always stays digital and does not degrade while passing through equipment. The project has necessitated the purchase of new encoder / multiplexers and new routing switchers as well as associated equipment.. Delivery of the new equipment was promised by October 23 so the extensive installation process could be completed before the telethon. Since the delivery did not make it as scheduled, we now must put the new system in phases or wait until after the telethon.
