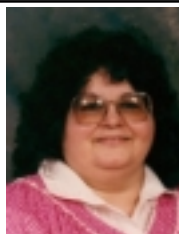

NEED A TAX BREAK?

The COACB is recognized by the IRS as a type 501c3 Not-For-Profit organization and donations to it are tax deductible. There are many tax laws that can greatly benefit those that donate to 501c3 organizations. Today we will look at just one of these, the donation of stock:

Should you have bought one hundred shares of Dish stock when it was \$2.00 per share your initial investment is \$200.00. Today that stock is worth \$30.00 per share. The IRS allows a donation credit for a donation of stock to be the value of the stock as of the day it is donated regardless of its value on the day it was purchased. So if 100 shares of DISH stock were donated today the person donating it can claim a donation tax credit of almost \$3,000 plus they get the good feeling of knowing they have helped spread the Gospel. Contact your accountant to learn of the many ways to benefit by donating to the COACB. Yes we are very good stewards of the Lord's money.

Try These Recipes

GINGER COOKIES

THELMA AIKEN

1 cup shortening; ½ cup sugar; 1 egg; ½ cup molasses; ¾ cup evaporated milk; ¾ tablespoon vinegar; 3 cups sifted flour; 2 teaspoons baking soda; 1 teaspoon salt; 1 teaspoon ginger; 1 teaspoon cinnamon

Cream shortening and sugar thoroughly. Add egg and molasses, beat well. Mix milk and vinegar. Sift together dry ingredients, add to creamed mixture, alternately with milk. Drop by teaspoon on greased cookie sheet. Bake in 375 degree oven and bake about 12 minutes. Makes 6 dozen cookies. Ginger Cookies are delicious with milk or fruit drinks.

1 - 24 oz pkg almond bark; 1 cup peanut butter; 8 cups Captain Krunch cereal; 1 cup salted peanuts

Melt almond bark according to package directions. Add peanut butter and mix. Remove from heat and stir in cereal and peanuts. Drop by spoonfuls onto wax paper. Let cool.

BARBECUE CHICKEN PIZZA

ANONYMOUS

2 boneless skinless chicken breast halves (about ½ lb.), cut into thin strips; 1 green pepper, cut into strips, ¼ cup thinly sliced red onion; 1 prepared pizza crust (12 inch); 1/3 cup Kraft Original Barbecue Sauce; 1 cup Kraft 2% Milk Shredded Reduced Fat Mozzarella Cheese; 1 cup Kraft Fat Free Shredded Non-Fat Mozzarella Cheese.

Spray large skillet with no stick cooking spray. Add chicken, green pepper and onion; cook on medium-high heat 4 to 5 minutes or until chicken is cooked through. Place crust on cookie sheet. Spread with barbecue sauce. Top with chicken mixture and cheese. Bake at 400 degrees for 15 to 18 minutes or until cheese is melted and crust is golden brown.

BANANA SPLIT CAKE

Crust: 2 cups graham cracker crumbs, 1 stick margarine, melted

Topping: 1 pkg. powdered sugar, sifted, 2 8-oz. pkgs. cream cheese, 1 tsp. vanilla, 4 to 5 bananas, sliced, 1 20-oz. can crushed pineapple, drained, cool whip, chopped pecans, 1 small jar maraschino cherries

To prepare the crust, combine graham cracker crumbs and margarine in a bowl. Place the mixture in a 9 x 14 in. pan; chill. Beat powdered sugar, cream cheese and vanilla; spread over crumb mixture. On top of cream mixture, place sliced bananas and crushed pineapple. Spread cool whip, chopped pecans and maraschino cherries on top. Refrigerate for a minimum of 4 hours before serving.
